

Summer Teen Volunteer Program

FAQs



What are the dates for the program?

The program is an eight-week session that runs **Monday, June 7 through Friday, July 30**. Prior to applying, teens are asked to carefully consider the required time commitment.

Will HonorHealth cancel the program due to COVID-19?

HonorHealth is committed to the Summer Teen Volunteer Program, and our hope is to run the program in Summer 2021. HonorHealth and Volunteer Services will closely monitor the situation and cancel or postpone the program if necessary.

Are volunteers required to receive the COVID-19 vaccine?

HonorHealth is not requiring COVID-19 vaccinations for volunteers.

What is the time commitment for the program?

The program requires a commitment of two, four-hour shifts each week with a minimum of six weeks participation. Volunteer times are 7 a.m. to 5 p.m. Monday-Friday.

What if I miss more than two weeks?

Volunteers are a valuable part of the campus' daily operations. If you're unable to commit to the time requirement, we ask that you reconsider applying for the program.

What is the deadline to apply?

The last day to apply is **5 p.m. on Monday, March 29**. Applications received after the deadline are considered on a first-come, first-served basis until the program is full.

What are the steps to apply?

You must submit each of the items below to the Volunteer Office **prior to the deadline of 5 p.m. on March 29**. Please attach the following items and email them to volunteers@honorhealth.com:

- Completed online application
- One-page document stating why you're interested in the Teen Volunteer Summer Program, what aspect of being a volunteer is most appealing to you and why
- Copy of your unofficial high school transcript
- Recommendation Form from someone outside of your immediate family (someone who can speak to your work ethic and/or character)
- Copy of your immunization record

I've submitted my application, what happens next?

You'll receive a confirmation email with additional information regarding next steps and attend a group interview with your first-choice campus on the date you selected in your application. Interviews are held remotely using Zoom.

What if I can't make my interview date?

We ask that you consider choosing your date carefully. We may not be able to accommodate changes.

How will I be notified of acceptance?

If accepted to the program, an HonorHealth representative will notify you via email.

Is everyone who applies to the program accepted?

No, it's a competitive application process as there are limited positions available at each campus.

What happens after I get accepted?

A parent (or guardian) and volunteer must attend a mandatory, two-hour orientation the week of Monday, May 10. Orientation location to be determined.

Teen volunteers must also attend a four-hour campus orientation specific to your role. Dates will vary.

Which campus will I be assigned to?

On the application, you can select a preferred campus, and we'll try our best to place you at the campus you chose.

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
