Located in Phoenix, Arizona, John C Lincoln Medical Center is a 262-bed, not-for-profit community hospital offering Level I trauma care, critical care, and a 24/7 emergency department. John C Lincoln Medical Center is an accredited Chest Pain Center and certified Primary Stroke Center, and has earned Magnet designation, the highest national designation for excellence in nursing care. The Department of Pharmacy provides 24/7 services, supported by approximately 50 pharmacy personnel. The hospital has a computerized electronic health record, an automated dispensing system, and decentralized clinical pharmacists.

Residency Program Specifics

The HonorHealth John C Lincoln Medical Center PGY1 Pharmacy Residency program is a 12-month full-time, commitment designed to train graduates in the skills needed to become well-rounded and competent clinical pharmacy practitioners. Established learning activities that align with goals and objectives for the program and incorporated learning experiences will facilitate resident progress toward achieving their professional goals and successfully completing the residency. The learning structure offers a self-motivated resident the opportunity to develop skills in several practice settings to provide optimal pharmaceutical care to diverse patient populations.

PGY1 Residency Program Purpose

The HonorHealth John C. Lincoln Medical Center PGY1 Pharmacy Residency Program will build on Doctor of Pharmacy education in order to contribute to the development of clinical pharmacists, responsible for medication-related care of patients with a wide range of conditions, eligible for board certification, and eligible for post-graduate year two (PGY2) pharmacy residency training.

Requirements for Successful Completion of Residency Program

Upon successful completion of all program requirements and compliance with all conditions of the residency program, HonorHealth John C Lincoln Medical Center will award the resident a certificate indicating successful completion of the PGY1 Pharmacy Residency Program. Residents who fail to complete all program requirements and comply with all conditions of the residency program will not be awarded a certificate of completion.

Residency Program Certificate of Completion Checklist*

The Residency Advisory Committee will discuss and determine a plan for any required elements that are not completed for each resident.

- All required and elective learning experiences must be successfully completed
- Achieved for the Residency (ACHR) on all goals and objectives in R1 and 80% of the learning objectives for R2 to R4 with no outstanding Needs Improvement
- Residency Virtual Binder in PharmAcademic must be completed
- All service/staffing requirements completed
- All required presentations completed
- All longitudinal responsibilities and projects completed:
 - ACPE-accredited continuing education (CE) presentation for pharmacists
 - Medication use evaluation (MUE)
 - Drug class review, monograph, treatment guideline, or protocol to advance pharmacy practice
 - Journal club
- Longitudinal residency research project completed and presented at a regional conference
- Final draft of the residency research project manuscript completed and approved by the primary preceptor and RPD
- Final evaluation of RPD and overall program submitted

* RPD will meet with each resident to assess completion of the above checklist during the last month of the residency year.
