

UNPLANNED HOSPITAL VISITS

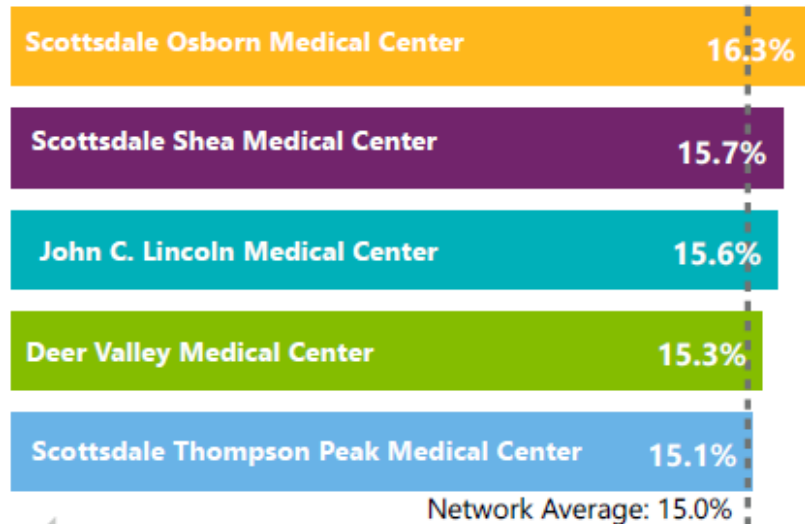

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What is HonorHealth doing to improve unplanned readmissions?

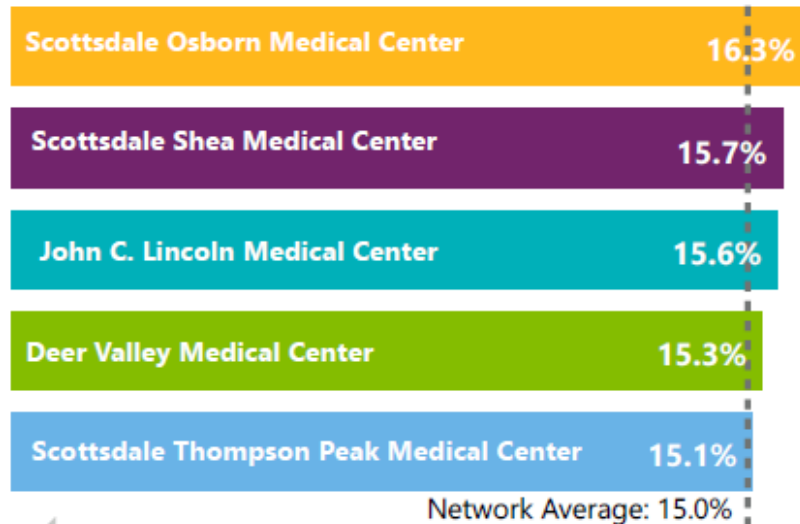

- Managing transition of care and medications for patients when they leave the hospital
- Helping patients in the emergency room find safe alternatives to get back home
- Working with community partners to keep patients healthy and out of the hospital
- Partnering with patients to manage their chronic diseases, decreasing the chance of needing to go to the hospital
