Dr. Sall is from Syracuse, New York and completed her undergraduate education at the University of Rochester, and her medical training at SUNY Upstate Medical University. She completed her Internal Medicine Residency at the University of Cincinnati (UC). During her Chief Resident year, Dr. Sall confirmed her passion for education and realized that connecting with learners was her calling. 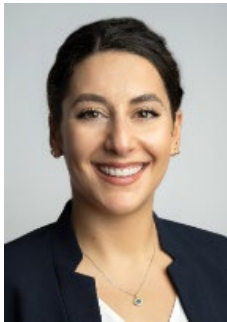

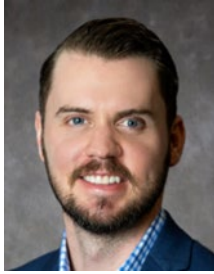

ADDICTION MEDICINE



Michael A. Sucher, MD, FASAM

Dr. Sucher graduated at Wayne State University where he received a Bachelor of Science Degree and Medical Degree.
