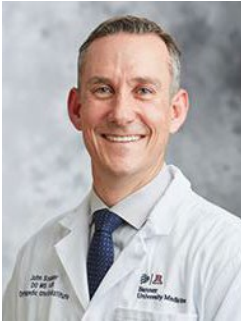
Robert Renfro, MD

**John Sollenberger, DO**

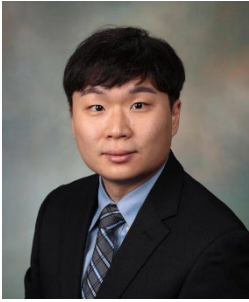
