Jacob McGowan, DO

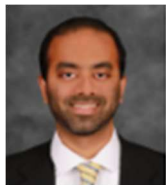

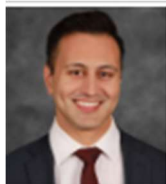
Nitin Khurana, MD
