

SCHOLARLY ACTIVITY IN THE HONORHEALTH JOHN C. LINCOLN MEDICAL CENTER GENERAL SURGERY RESIDENCY PROGRAM

2017-2018 EXECUTIVE SUMMARY

Overview

The purpose of the General Surgery Scholarly Activity Program is to provide residents with a strong foundation in research, ensure their effectiveness in evaluating the care of the patient in terms of best practices and their proficiency in critical appraisal of peer-reviewed literature, which will help residents develop a pattern of lifelong learning habits. The Scholarly Activity Program (SAP) is designed to fulfill the residency program's Practice-Based Learning goals. Scholarly activities of residents & faculty are documented & assessed regularly as a part of the General Surgery Program evaluation and is also assessed through the annual ACGME Faculty & Resident Survey.

This executive summary is organized into 3 parts. In Part I, scholarly activity processes and structure are identified and described. Part II provides further details regarding resources in place to support activities. Part III includes a list of annual resident activities and faculty activities over the last 5 years.

PART I – Processes for Scholarly Activity & Research

The Scholarly Activity Program is administered through a variety of teaching strategies, including regular instruction through didactics sessions (interesting case presentations, history lectures), attendance and participation in HonorHealth’s “ResQIPS” workshop series (Research, Quality Improvement, Patient Safety), engaged participation in research projects, journal club and at residency-based conferences (General Surgery M&M, TPIC, Tumor Board). Residents are also required to regularly submit scientific abstracts, posters and/or manuscripts to professional associations and publishers with the intent to present at conferences or publish in peer-reviewed journals.

The sections below provide further details for each type of scholarly activity.

Community Service and Education

Residents will be encouraged to participate in community events focused on delivering medical care to under-serviced or impoverished areas of the population. Tracking and recording of these efforts will be required.

A. Suggestions for residents:

1. Medical Explorers – one hour credit
2. Hernia clinics – one hour credit for each hour worked
3. Stop the bleed
4. Teaching Medical students (see “resident teaching role” for additional details)
5. Volunteer time for approved non-profit health agencies – one hour credit for each hour worked.
6. Other volunteer work for credit must be approved in advance by the Program Director

Faculty Research and Scholarly Activity

Core teaching faculty will be required to demonstrate involvement in resident research projects by providing guidance and support to residents. In addition, teaching faculty will be required to participate in clinical discussions and conferences along with on-site faculty development and training. All faculty will be encouraged to participate in national and regional professional organizations related to the ACGME and ACOS.

Faculty are responsible for committing and scheduling time to support the scholarly activities of residents. During such time, faculty provide direct consultation & advisement on research topics & the research process and provide ongoing guidance throughout the entire project timeline. Faculty also select peer-reviewed and clinically significant research articles for residents to review, appraise & present during journal club activities.

Faculty are also responsible for the development & implementation of their own scholarly activities in order to expand their own knowledgebase and contribute to the body of literature in their specialties. Details of these activities can be found in Part III of this summary.

Journal Club

All reading assignments are mandatory and provide a meaningful program of self-directed learning for each resident. The resident is required to attend the monthly Surgical Journal Club meetings and shall review the subject matter assigned to him/her by the faculty or senior surgical resident. These activities are intended to assist residents in critically analyzing their own care against the most up-to-date information on diagnosis and treatment effectiveness. Residents are also assigned topics for presentation that expand upon active and recent clinical cases on the teaching services as well as reinforce important curricular areas.

The reading assignment should closely follow the curriculum in reference to the assigned topics to be covered at each level of training. In addition specific texts will be listed for required reading over the 5 year period. These supplemental texts are to be used to review the disease and surgical treatment according to the daily surgical schedule and will be reviewed and updated accordingly. Journal club will be supervised by a Board Certified physician as assigned by the Program Director.

Morbidity and Mortality Conference

Residents will review patient deaths and complications, as well as a review of interesting cases, and will submit written summaries of individual cases for this conference. The program director reviews the cases and determines which cases are to be presented. The focus will be on education. This conference will be directed and supervised by a Board Certified physician as assigned by the Program Director.

National Convention and Conferences

Residents will be required to attend 1 ACOS Annual Postgraduate Seminar or 1 Annual Meeting starting in the fifth year of residency. Allocation of funds will be made available for resident's attendance.

Quality Projects & Teams

All residents are encouraged to participate in a quality team and or project within the base hospital institution. These quality projects include quality measures, patient safety and risk management. Residents are required to be knowledgeable on the base hospital's policy on reporting medical errors and near misses. This includes specific forms, peer review committees, and reporting requirements to Program Directors and/or departments. This will be at the discretion of the Program Director and base institution.

COMMUNITY-BASED EFFORT QUALITY IMPROVEMENT PROJECT Residents may select a specific health improvement or disease prevention issue or need within the community. The Resident must identify a population of interest within a community, summarize the problem and the population, review the current literature, perform a needs assessment, and design, implement and evaluate an intervention to address the issue or need.

MEDICAL EDUCATION QUALITY INITIATIVE IMPROVEMENT PROJECT The aim of this type of project is to provide more effective training processes and programs for medical students, interns and residents. Residents who wish to pursue a Medical Education Quality Initiative project must identify a process or program need, review the current literature, perform a needs assessment, and design, implement and evaluate the proposed improvement project. For example, a resident could prepare three lectures to be given in three different mediums to the house staff, then measure the impact of those lectures by evaluating the effectiveness of the resident as a lecturer and testing the knowledge retained by attendees.

Resident Teaching Role

Resident will learn supervisory skills by observing and learning from the example of their mentors and teaching faculty. In addition, residents will develop lectures, curriculum outlines, and testing materials and serve as lecturers and other based on requirements for students and residents throughout the program year. This will be accomplished through local resident didactic lectures and via Video conferencing.

ResQIPS Curriculum and Workshop Series

Residents must be well-versed in inquiry: research, quality improvement, leveraging human and electronic resources, and applying research findings to improve patient care. To support these efforts HonorHealth has developed an innovative framework and curriculum called ResQIPS (Research, Quality Improvement and Patient Safety) linking education and support on QI/PS activities to scholarship with the intent of increasing scholarly projects and improving outcomes. ResQIPS is designed to support the advancement of research, quality improvement and scholarship for the network's medical residency programs and, more broadly, across multiple disciplines in the network. The ResQIPS learning objectives are as follows:

- Design a significant clinical question that aligns with the ResQIPS Framework
- Describe the steps involved in conducting investigator-initiated human subject research & prepare for IRB application submission
- Use Quality data and tools to support practice or improvement initiatives
- Describe methodology and design considerations for QI and Research projects
- Identify tools, resources and mentors needed to support research activities
- Develop a scholarly project
- Collect and analyze data
- Disseminate findings through local, regional or national presentations and/or through peer-reviewed journal article publication

The curriculum is offered as a series of mandatory workshops with individual mentoring support offered to residents and other learners between workshops. Resident, Faculty and IPE projects are showcased to the organization in poster and presentation sessions annually.

Scholarly Activities & Research Papers

All residents will be required to complete specified scholarly activities, in accordance with ACGME scholarly activity and research requirements and ACS Level 1 Trauma Verification requirements.

Scholarly activities include, but are not limited to, the following:

- a retrospective or prospective research project;
- journal club, case presentations; symposium, poster and abstract presentations;
- community-based and medical-education based quality improvement projects;
- practice improvement projects;
- technique descriptions and/or essays suitable for publication;
- a scientific research paper for General Vascular Surgery, Plastic/Reconstructive Surgery, Surgical Critical Care or Cardiothoracic Surgery.

Residents will provide a detailed description of all scholarly activities with documentation, as necessary. Scholarly activity reports will be filed and are subject to review by site visitors/auditors during periodic reviews of the program for continuing accreditation.

It is recommended that reviews of scholarly activity be done on at least a quarterly basis. It is imperative that written documentation of all aspects of the resident's scholarly activities be maintained in the resident's file. Program Directors need to be kept informed of the status of each resident's efforts in order for a narrative description and evaluation of their scholarly activity to be included in the Program Director's Annual Resident Evaluation Report for Surgery.

SCHOLARLY RESEARCH PROJECT Residents will complete a scholarly research project annually in one of four areas to include: Clinical Research, Community Based, Medical Education and Practice Improvement. The Program Director will approve all resident research projects. Residents will be expected to attend regular sessions for review and evaluation of their progress with their Program Director, which should include discussion of study design and analysis.

HonorHealth John C. Lincoln Medical Center and Midwestern University both have resources available to assist residents in the design, development and publication of scholarly papers.

Research training will be provided to residents via lecture, journal club sessions and other workshops or webinars as needed. Residents also attend the HonorHealth Research, Quality Improvement and Patient Safety half-day conferences (ResQIPS) which are collaborative, interprofessional events planned by Academic Affairs, Quality, HonorHealth Research Institute, Center for Clinical Excellence and Library Services. Training includes:

- CITI human subject protections training;
- understanding the significance of a scientific study or project and how it addresses important clinical problems and/or critical barriers to progress in the field;
- identification of improvements made to scientific knowledge, technical capability and clinical practice when projects aims are achieved;
- recognition of changes in various aspects, methodologies, technologies, services, and therapies & preventative interventions when project aims are met;
- formulation of specific, researchable clinical queries and familiarity with the PICOT algorithm;
- performing a literature search using reference databases and literature citation management software; creation of an annotated bibliography;
- critical appraisal of primary research literature, including analyzing the appropriateness of research designs and statistical methods, and relevance to patient care that the resident provides.

- defining independent and dependent variables and outcomes of impact to clinical practice
- understanding of other research-related concepts, including research designs, scientific methods, data collection & statistical analysis, and dissemination of new information through reports and publications.

PREPARATION AND SUBMISSION OF MANUSCRIPTS, PAPERS AND PROGRESS REPORTS

Residents will adhere to the following:

- A. All manuscripts must be typed and submitted in an appropriate format acceptable for publication in a standard scientific refereed journal.
- B. An abstract must accompany each manuscript. The cover sheet must list the program for which credit is to be applied and a statement that the resident is the primary author, or performed substantive participation in the study and that the paper has been reviewed and approved. This must be signed and attested to by the Program Director. Manuscripts shall be submitted in one of the following formats only:
 1. A case presentation of a first reported case or other unusual manifestations of a disease which will add to the medical literature, which should include a review of the literature and discussion (acceptable only if submitted for publication).
 2. A report of an original clinical research study approved by the Program Director and the institutional review board.
 3. A case presentation and discussion which challenges existing concepts of diagnosis or treatment and thus recommends further investigation.
- C. Initially, the resident should submit a written proposal to the Program Director for review and approval and prepared under the supervision of the Program Director or another physician approved by the Program Director. Residents may work jointly on an original clinical research project, provided a progress report and written approval of the Program Director is included in Part II of the Resident Annual Report. Residents may not work jointly on case reports. Residents shall submit the required manuscript within thirty (30) days of completing the final year of training.
 1. Program Directors will document the status of all research as part of the Resident Semi-Annual Evaluations.

RESEARCH TIMELINE Residents are expected to select a research project during the PGY-2 year. This project must be reviewed and discussed with the program director, mentor or faculty advisor. Appropriate timelines will be determined in order to complete research. Program Directors will not sign off on promotion and/or program graduation if research projects are incomplete.

SICU/Trauma/Burn Conference

Weekly conferences will be provided to residents and will feature important topics in critical care, trauma, and burn surgery. Topics are chosen by the attending/teaching surgeons in these divisions at the beginning of each academic year, and approved by the program director.

Junior residents on these services are assigned the topics and asked to prepare a short (20 minute) PowerPoint presentation. Teaching faculty/attending surgeons from these divisions then lead a brief discussion on the topic following the presentation.

PART II – Resources for Scholarly Activity & Research

HonorHealth Research Institute

The HonorHealth Research Institute (HRI) provides both institutional and scientific review for all research activities at the organization, including the scholarly projects of residents and faculty. All research performed at HonorHealth is based on scientific principles and carried out using the highest quality standards. The HRI assists in setting the standard for excellence in personalized healthcare by developing a culture of inquisitiveness, leading to the provision of the best evidence-based medicine to patients and the community. HRI provides the following:

- research administration staff responsible for ensuring that all research performed at HonorHealth is in compliance with relevant state and Federal requirements and that it fulfills the HonorHealth mission;
- documentation to guide researchers through the process of both investigator- and sponsor-initiated studies;
- guidance on scientific and institutional review board submissions;
- access to human subject protections training;
- access to local resources, including statisticians and other personnel experienced in research;
- Office of Sponsored Programs (OSP), which is responsible for supporting researchers in the identification and submission of grants.

Midwestern University Office of Research and Sponsored Programs (ORSP)

The ORSP office provides a wide variety of resources to support scholarly & research activities of residents and faculty:

- publishes a monthly newsletter highlighting news & opportunities
- provides online access to policies, forms and funding sources
- support in preparing proposals for submission to sponsors, including budget development, institutional and scientific review
- provides funding opportunities for research

The Midwestern University Osteopathic Postdoctoral Training Institute (OPTI) requires all specialty college research related educational objectives be fulfilled by residents, as applicable. Documentation of research activities will be kept on file. To assist the resident in this endeavor the OPTI will provide:

- Support to facilitate participation in completing research requirements and projects required by specialty colleges.
- Research resources and research opportunities through the Office of Research and Sponsored Programs.
- Mentors from Midwestern University & University of Arizona College of Medicine (MWU/AZCOM) Basic Science and Clinical Faculty.
- Options for meeting the research requirement shall be determined by the Program Director and may include, but not be limited to, any of the following:
- Original research studies (basic science, clinical studies, health services research), and writing, once per training program;
- Retrospective studies (medical records analysis) once per training program.

HonorHealth Library Resources

ACCESSIBILITY HonorHealth Osborn Medical Center, Shea Medical Center and John C Lincoln Medical Center libraries provide 24/7 access to single workstations as well as meeting/collaboration space. The libraries also maintain a Web-based library portal which is available on-site through the employee intranet and off-site through Athens (authentication software). Librarians provide mobile app support for several key resources:

- UpToDate clinical decision support system
- Elsevier's ClinicalKey resource which contains the FirstConsult clinical decision support system along with thousands of high-impact electronic textbooks and journals, practice guidelines, over 340 procedure/skills videos, image library and PresentationMaker component to support presentations
- Micromedex drug information, IV compatibilities, drug/herbal/food interactions, other pharmaceutical tools & calculators; also includes Pediatric Essentials & NeoFax Essentials

LIBRARIAN SUPPORT A wide range of library services are provided by the HonorHealth librarian team, which consists of 4.0 FTE American Library Association accredited medical librarians. Outside of physically staffed hours, librarians can be emailed or contacted by phone at the health science library locations.

Personalized services available at HonorHealth libraries include:

- Mediated (librarian-assisted) literature searching using databases and search engines that access published and unpublished evidence (results delivered with 48 hours of receiving request)
- Mediated “state of the science” literature reviews, including a synopsis of findings and critical appraisal of the literature, to support patient care needs
- Mediated searching for acute & chronic disease management and general health & wellness information for patients & families (results delivered within 48 hours of receiving request)
- Research consultations, including research question brainstorming and development using the PICOT algorithm, identification of appropriate resources for searching, search strategy development and database manipulation guidance
- Citation management, presentation and publishing support, including identification of appropriate journals to consider for submission and formatting, reference lists and footnoting support according to publisher’s instructions for authors.
- Document retrieval & delivery (delivery frequently same-day, otherwise 1-3 days of receiving request)
- One-on-one and small group training on all library databases & tools, ranging from quick overviews of resources & research tools to advanced/expert search strategy training
- Technical assistance and training for the UpToDate clinical decision website and mobile app, the ClinicalKey site and mobile app, and the Micromedex suite and mobile apps.
- Meeting and collaboration space, which includes an LCD TV and conference table with electrical outlets
- Provision of reliable, easy-to-read, evidence-based consumer health & wellness resources for patients & families as well as for residents & faculty as they communicate with and educate their patients
- Health literacy consultation services, including review of proposed patient education & discharge instructions and recommendations to improve readability and comprehension, which improves patient outcomes overall and reduces hospital readmissions

CONTENT – GENERAL HonorHealth Library Services provide access to numerous print & electronic resources. Many have been acquired through membership to the Arizona Health Information Network (AZHIN), a statewide consortium uniting communication technology and resource access in the Arizona health care and health education communities. Other resources are acquired through Library Service’s operation budget and HonorHealth Foundation funding. Resources include:

- Evidence-based medicine (Cochrane Library, MedCalc3000, UpToDate, FirstConsult)
- Journal literature databases (PubMed, Ovid Medline, Ebsco Medline with Full Text, CINAHL Complete, Health Business Elite)
- Research and scholarly project tools (research instruments/scales, theses/dissertations)
- Faculty resources (ProceduresConsult, Teacher Reference Center)
- eBooks, Full-text (ClinicalKey, STAT!Ref, Ovid Books)
- eJournals, Full-text (JAMA and JAMA Archives, Lancet, NEJM, and thousands more through Medline with Full Text, CINAHL Complete, ClinicalKey and other database collections)
- Drug information (Micromedex and Lexi-Comp via UpToDate)
- Herbals & Supplements (Alternative Medicines database within Micromedex)

Electronic resources are easily accessible on-site via the employee/intranet site. They are also accessible off-site through authentication software (Athens). Athens accounts are assigned upon request.

CONTENT – SUBJECT-SPECIFIC HonorHealth Library Services provides access to a variety of electronic and print resources to directly support the educational & reference needs of General Surgery residents & faculty, including textbooks, journals and multimedia content.

- Journal literature databases – general (MEDLINE/PubMed/MEDLINE Complete, Health Business Elite, ScienceDirect, & Web of Knowledge)
- Journal literature databases – subject specific (CINAHL, Dentistry and Oral Sciences Source (DOSS), PsycINFO, PsycBOOKS, Sport Discus, VisionCite, & Visionet)

3. UpToDate is an ACCME-accredited evidence-based clinical decision support resource provided for healthcare practitioners to help them make the right decisions at the point of care.
4. FirstConsult/Clinical Overviews (via ClinicalKey) is an authoritative, evidence-based and continuously updated clinical information resource for healthcare professionals. Designed for use at the point-of-care, it provides instant, user-friendly access to the latest information on evaluation, diagnosis, clinical management, prognosis, and prevention. Sections include: Medical Topics comprise clinically compiled information on patient evaluation, diagnosis, treatment, tests, prevention, and much more; Differential Diagnoses presents an evaluation of a patient's complaint with interactive access to potential diagnoses by age and prevalence. Procedures provide clear systematic guidance, including videos and medical animations, of procedures to the practice of medicine

B. Journal literature databases

1. The MEDLINE database is the premier biomedical database in the United States. It contains over 23 million references to more than 5,600 journals in life sciences with a concentration on biomedicine generally dating back to about 1949, with some older material. The subject scope of MEDLINE is biomedicine and health, broadly defined to encompass those areas of the life sciences, behavioral sciences, chemical sciences, and bioengineering needed by health professionals and others engaged in basic research and clinical care, public health, health policy development, or related educational activities. Access is provided via 3 different search platforms: Ovid, EBSCO, and National Library of Medicine (PubMed). All HonorHealth journal content is accessible through link resolvers in all 3 search platforms, making it easy for researchers to access full-text articles in real-time.
2. CINAHL (Cumulative Index to Nursing and Allied Health Literature) provides indexing for more than 3,000 journals from the fields of nursing and allied health. The database contains more than 2.6 million records dating back to 1981. Offering complete coverage of English-language nursing journals and publications from the National League for Nursing and the American Nurses' Association, CINAHL covers nursing,

biomedicine, health sciences librarianship, alternative/complementary medicine, consumer health and 17 allied health disciplines.

3. Health Business Elite database covers the journal literature concerning the business of health care. It provides full-text coverage of more than 130 well-known administrative journals such as H&HN: Hospitals & Health Networks, Health Management Technology, Modern Healthcare, and many others. APPENDIX B – Descriptions of Midwestern University Library Services Resources

A. Anatomy

1. Anatomy.TV is an interactive regional anatomy resource containing images that can be viewed layer by layer and can be rotated. Several specialty modules are included, such as: sports injuries, hand therapy, and dentistry. Acland's Video Atlas of Human Anatomy provides videos of dissected fresh human specimens.

B. Drug information

1. Facts & Comparisons is the full-text electronic version of Drug Facts & Comparisons. It contains information on drug and herbal interactions, a chemotherapy manual, directories of manufacturers, and pill identification with many color images. MICROMEDEX provides information and complete monographs on thousands of drugs. It includes toxicity information, therapeutic doses, pill identification, and dosing calculators. The complete drug monographs in this resource are often considered to be the "gold standard". Lexi-Comp is another drug information product, with features including aural pronunciation of the drugs' names and chemotherapy regimes.

C. eBooks, Full-text

1. The full-text of hundreds of respected medical, dental, and nursing textbooks can be found in STAT!Ref, NetLibrary, R2 eBook Library, MD Consult, and the Access suite of products (Anesthesiology, Emergency Medicine, Medicine, Pediatrics, Pharmacy, and Surgery). STAT!Ref alone includes over 120 textbooks. There is very little overlap among the eBook collections. Thousands more ebooks are available via the eBooks link on the library's home page.

D. eJournals, Full-text

1. Thousands of full-text eJournals and their articles are available through the eJournals link on the library's home page. Journal issues can be browsed or articles can be identified in the journal literature databases, which are then linked back to the full-text articles via the "Get it @ MWU" button

E. Evidence-based medicine

1. The Cochrane Library contains the full-text of the Cochrane Database of Systematic Reviews. It includes reliable evidence from Cochrane and other systematic reviews, clinical trials, and more, bringing you the combined results of the world's best medical research studies. It is recognized as the gold standard in evidence-based health care. Essential Evidence Plus uses practicing professionals to identify and summarize the most valid and clinically-applicable new evidence from the best research findings gleaned from a continuous survey of the top worldwide medical journals. POEMs (Patient-Oriented Evidence that Matters) have to meet three criteria: they address a question that clinicians will face, they measure outcomes that clinicians and their patients care about (symptoms, morbidity, quality of life, and mortality), and they have the potential to change the way clinicians practice. UpToDate is an evidence-based knowledge system authored by physicians to help clinicians make the right decisions at the point of care.

F. Herbals & Supplements

1. Natural Standard allows users to search for natural products, including foods, herbs, supplements, genomics, and proteomics. The monographs include information about interactions and comparative effectiveness. Other topics include health and wellness issues and medical conditions. This resource provides high quality, evidence-based information about complementary and alternative therapies. Natural Medicines contains over 1,000 evidence-based monographs providing in depth information including: common, colloquial, & brand names, scientific names, product uses, safety, effectiveness, description of known constituents, pharmacological actions, adverse reactions, possible interactions, any influence on nutrient levels and depletion in the body after use of the substance(s), and dosage and administration.

G. Integrated resources

1. AccessMedicine, and the other resources in this suite of products, provide access to access to well-known medical titles, thousands of images and illustrations, interactive self-assessment, case files, time-saving diagnostic and point-of-care tools, etc. MD Consult helps physicians answer clinical questions and stay abreast of recent developments by integrating 50 respected medical reference books (full-text), over 100 medical journals and clinics (full-text), MEDLINE, comprehensive information on 30,000 drugs, more than 1000 clinical practice guidelines, over 3,500 customizable patient education handouts, many in Spanish, and online CME. Also included are highlights on recent drug approvals, a weekly review of new developments in medicine, and the key contents of several major journals are presented each week.

H. Journal literature databases – general

1. The MEDLINE database is the premier biomedical database in the United States. Access is provided via 3 different search platforms: Ovid, EBSCO, and PubMed. It contains bibliographic citations and author abstracts from more than 5,600 biomedical journals published around the world. The database contains well over 22 million citations dating back to the 1940's. Although coverage is worldwide, most records are derived from English-language sources or have English abstracts. Each of these providers links to some full-text articles. The "Get it @ MWU" button provides additional full-text article access. Health Business Elite covers the journal literature concerning the business of health care. ScienceDirect and Web of Knowledge cover a wider range of the sciences and have many useful, special features.

I. Journal literature databases – subject specific

1. Midwestern provides access to many journal literature databases focusing on specific subject areas within the health sciences. CINAHL (Cumulative Index to Nursing and Allied Health Literature) includes nursing, physician assistants, occupational & physical therapy, among 14 other allied health professions. Dentistry and Oral Sciences Source covers the dental literature. PsycINFO and the other databases, from the American Psychological Association, focus on the psychology literature dating as far back as the 1800s. Sport Discus covers sports and sports medicine topics. VisionCite and Visionet cover topics in optometry and ophthalmology.

J. Drug Information Center

1. Midwestern University has opened a Drug Information Center with access being offered free of charge, exclusively to our preceptors. The Center is staffed during business hours by pharmacy students and residents with all questions being reviewed by a pharmacist. The Center has access to books, databases and journals. All information provided by the Center is based on published literature. The goal of the

Drug information Center is to assist in the provision of quality patient care by providing evidence-based answers to clinical questions. Preceptors may use the Center to assist with any question that comes up in practice. Some recent examples are: "What is the dose of ketorolac for a patient undergoing hemodialysis?" or "Can sertraline cause a hot-flash type of reaction?"

K. Matthews Bookstore

1. Faculty & preceptors receive a 10% discount on purchases made at the University's bookstore. Matthews accepts orders via phone and will ship purchases to office or home free of charge.
